Magnetic paint

Magnetic paint – What is it?

Magnetic paint is a non –flammable, child friendly, lead free dark grey , acrylic water based paint with a high iron content. Once dry it can be painted over it with any other paint or colour you wish.

Magnetic paint – How does it work?

Magnetic paint can change any surface from a normal one, to one that will hold fridge magnets and the like. It is a simple and practical idea for use in any room. An “invisible” display area for the office, class room, schools and so on- simply anywhere you need a display surface.

Schools, Children’s bedrooms etc:

Any classroom wall can be coated with the magnetic paint, and afterwards decorated with a mural etc. Using small magnets you can hold letters, telephone numbers, or what you will-use corridors or class room walls for display purposes. Quickly display drawings and artwork on any flat surface.

This paint does away with the need for special boards, as almost anything can be utilised without recourse to pins or tape all is needed are just small magnets

Office presentations:

Use the office wall without damaging the surface or the need for special boards. The area used can be painted over any colour that you wish or papered. Ideal for presentations and notices etc.

Magnetic Paint : the main advantages are that it replaces, posters, sellotape, glue strips etc?

Easy to apply – can be used without damaging walls, no need for nails, pins etc . All you will need is a collection of magnets.

How and what can I use the paint on?

Do not thin, use it at room temperature. Apply with sponge, brush or roller – a roller is best on larger areas. Rinse any brushes or tools afterwards with water. Spillages can be mopped up with a wet cloth.

The surface to be painted should be clean and smooth as possible and not too porous. Apply the grey coloured magnetic paint with a roller or brush until an even colour is achieved. Leave to dry for 4 hours and then add a further coat if required. The more coats the stronger the effect. Leave to dry thoroughly after the last coat, finally give the surface a quick sand before adding a further coat of wallpaper or paint. Apply a sealer to wood first before coating with the magnetic paint. If you wish to remove it later you can wall paper any surface and then apply the magnetic paint

How much do I need?

250 ml is enough for 1,5 square metres (one coat).

The Magnetic paint is not itself magnetic but contains a degree of iron so that any magnet will adhere to it. The surface itself will have no influence on a heart pacemaker, PC or any other electronic devices
