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***Cellulose based glue in powder form
for paper, card and paper mache***

Contents 250gm

Powder for 15 litres of glue

Possible mixtures:

Thick, non runny:	40gm / per litre
Thick, runny:	20gm / per litre
Thin, runny:	15 gm/ per litre

Mixed glue, can be stored for some time in an air tight container

Instructions:

1. Paper Mache

Sprinkle 5 Table spoons (20gms) of powder into 1 litre of water, stirring as you go.
Leave to stand for approx 30 mins.
Stir well once more and dilute with water to the required thickness.
Add newspaper strips to the mixture, leave to soak.
Make your model and allow to dry slowly.

2. Gluing- Paper / Card

Sprinkle 5 Table spoons of powder into 1 litre of water, stirring as you go.
Leave to stand for approx 30 mins.
Stir well once more.
Apply the glue thinly with a brush.

3. Painting

Mix 200ml water, 6 Teaspoons of powder colour and 3 Teaspoons of powder glue. Stir well, heat and bring to the boil for a few seconds, stir and allow to cool.
Pour the mixture into a container and use as finger paints.
Making wrapping paper:
Use the colours you have just made and paint them with a brush on to the sheet. Make patterns with comb or use a finger to generate your own designs.
Leave to cool

4. Making hollow forms/ masks

Paste small glue soaked paper strips over the outside of an inflated balloon. Once you have applied a few layers let them dry.
When dry deflate the balloon and take it out. This is a good way of making masks.
